Project Summary (100 words or less) -

The Northeastern Alliance CECC is requesting \$57,900 to provide seamless transition to Kindergarten by providing education of school readiness standards and parent support. In addition to collaboratively providing child abuse prevention and awareness activities, community baby showers, and training for Early Care and Education Professionals with our community partners. The Alliance will expand the Brigance Pilot Project to support instruction and ensure children are school ready. The long term goal of the council in conjunction with the local school districts is to provide support for parents from "Diapers to Diplomas".

Summary of Previous Activities –

The Northeastern Alliance Community Early Childhood Council collaborated with many Community Partners to provide the following programs:

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION ACTIVITIES

These events are held throughout the month of April in each county. Parents, early care and education professionals, and community members had the opportunity to attend and receive information about recognizing and reporting child abuse.

Community agencies set up booths with a hands-on activity for children and information for attendees. Collaborative partners included: area FRYSC'S, Health Department, DCBS, hospitals, libraries, local governments, Community Collaboration for Children, Children Advocacy Center, Mental Health agency and other agencies depending on the county. School systems participated in a design a t-shirt contest with a prevent child abuse theme. They also provided students to lead the Pledge of Allegiance as well as provide entertainment. Attendance in each county is very good and is documented by

sign-in sheets. The NACECC was able reach a large number of families and give them information regarding the council, early childhood developmental milestones and resources available to them. These events will be repeated because we have seen such a large number of participants in attendance and we are able to collaborate with a large number of other agencies who are working toward the same goals.

PARENT UNIVERSITY/FAMILY INVOLVEMENT NIGHTS

Each county provided parenting workshops and other designated family nights during the year. These nights provided parents, educational professionals, and community members opportunities to learn more about topics such as (but not limited to) substance abuse, child abuse and neglect, budgeting, nutrition, raising children with disabilities, behavior management, helping your child have a successful school year, health issues, internet safety, available resources in each community, fire safety, bike safety, and Kentucky Standards for Learning and School Readiness. These workshops were presented by credentialed speakers to provide child care training hours, foster care hours, as well as professional development for educators. Attendance was documented by sign-in sheet. Collaborative partners included: area FRYSC'S, Community Collaboration for Children, Child Care Aware of FIVCO, local hospitals, Health Departments, Library, Extension Office, 4-H, Children Advocacy Center, DCBS, ALERT Regional Prevention Center, Ashland Regional Training Center, and school system personnel and Administration. These family events will continue in the future.

KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION PROGRAMS

Each Family Resource Center Coordinator designed their kindergarten transition program to meet the needs of their school with the goal of defining the importance of

school readiness to each parent. Children familiarized themselves with the school and teachers attended to help them transition into the kindergarten setting and be prepared for a successful learning experience. These events took place prior to the start date of the school year with every kindergarten student receiving an invitation. Attendance averaged 80% of students and parents, which was documented by sign-in sheet. At these events parents received information on school programs and requirements, community agencies gave parents information about available resources, and NACECC encouraged parents to sign up for age-appropriate information from a variety of websites. These transition programs will continue as they are vital to a successful start to the school year for our Kindergarteners.

CHILD CARE PROVIDER TRAINING

Training was provided throughout the year to help Early Care and Education Professionals obtain the necessary training hours. Local agencies that helped provide the training included but was not limited to: area FRYSC's, hospitals, Health Departments, Library, Ashland Regional Training Center, Child Advocacy Center, ALERT Regional Prevention Center, Child Care Council of Kentucky, Extension Office, H.A.N.D.S., and Adult Education. The Early Care in Education Extravaganza was a huge success last year for the council and we were able to provide 6 hours of free training instead of just the 3 hours we had set as a goal.

SEAMLESS TRANSITION BIRTH TO PRE-SCHOOL

Each county provided information to parents through child care centers, pediatric medical offices, hospitals, health department, public libraries, H.A.N.D.S, and First Steps explaining the different stages of development to ensure a healthy start to pre-

school/Head Start or kindergarten. To facilitate transitions, parents received written information with age-appropriate guidelines, parents were encouraged to sign up for newsletters and emails from a number of parenting sources, parents were informed about the H.A.N.D.S. and First Steps programs, pre-school children were screened and referred to appropriate resources, and the council purchased early literacy books through First Book and/or Scholastic. The council will continue to provide support to families with children 0-3 and will extend this by ensuring the every family with an infant that leaves King Daughters Medical Center will do so with a wealth of information about child development and available resources.

SCREENING TRAINING

Our Council realized the need for pre-school children to be screened and purchased four Brigance Screening Kits, extra data sheets, and 1 year of online data management. In order to receive access to the screening kits; child care centers had to attend **The Introduction to the Brigance** training. Attendance was documented by sign in sheets and submitted for verification to the ECE-TRIS. This will continue for the new centers that need to be trained. To date the council has trained 57 Early Care and Education Professionals on the Brigance Screener.

ANNUAL MEETING

Our Council sent two representatives to the Early Childhood Annual Meeting. At this meeting, those two members were able to increase their knowledge about early childhood programs, network with members of other councils, and receive technical assistance for grant writing. In Fiscal Year 2013-14, two representatives will attend the

Ready Kids Conference. Chairperson attended the Regional Technical Assistance Training in March 2014.

STARS

In collaboration with Sandy Thomas, STARS SQC – our Council promoted the STARS program to all child care programs to ensure quality child care in our counties. Child Care centers were held responsible for meeting guidelines. Centers reaching STARS rating status or maintaining STARS ratings qualified for an incentive. Existing STAR rated Centers received \$300 for their continued STARS rating and new STARS rated Centers received \$357 upon receipt of STAR certificate or STARS Quality Coordinator verification. Due to the changes in the STARS Quality Enhancement Initiative that are a result of the Race to the Top grant received by the Governor's Office of Early Childhood we will not continue to offer incentive packages to centers.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION CONFERENCE

Our Council was a partner for the Child Abuse Prevention Conference held in Morehead, KY in April 2013 and 2014. This Conference was a collaborative effort between the Family Resource Youth Service Centers, Community Collaboration for Children Regional Networks from FIVCO, Buffalo Trace and Gateway Area Development Districts, DCBS Northeastern Region, and a variety of other child-centered entities. This was a two-day event with a national speaker. The registration showed that nearly 300 people attended the program each year. This partnership will continue as we are able to reach a large number of child-centric professionals.

COMMUNITY BABY SHOWER

Each county in our council partnered with the organizations in their county to offer a community baby shower during the past year. Each county held an event that fit their needs. Carter County focused on teenagers who are expecting as well as other first time parents. Boyd, Greenup and Elliott counties offered a program in conjunction with HANDS and had a fantastic turnout with giveaways and community agencies present to share resources. The partnership to provide community baby showers will continue in the coming year.

The Northeastern Alliance Community Early Childhood Council has been in existence since 2010 when the Boyd County Council merged with the Northeast Council that served Carter, Elliot and Greenup Counties. Funding levels for NACECC have been:

Community Needs

The Northeastern Alliance Community Early Childhood Council serves Boyd, Carter, Elliott and Greenup Counties in Northeastern Kentucky. According to the 2014 Early Childhood Profiles for each county there are many strengths and weaknesses this area of the state would be considered "urban". Within the four counties, there are 6,880 children under the age of four; 39% of those children are living under 100% of the federal poverty level, well above the 29.9% for the entire state of Kentucky. Currently, more than half of all children in the four counties entering kindergarten are not ready to

perform at the level expected by state school readiness standards. The table below is a breakdown of vital information by county:

Family Resource Center's annual family needs assessment reported a significant increase in grandparents raising grandchildren in 2013-14 school year. Teachers report more and more children arriving at school not ready to learn. They also report increasing difficulty in engaging families in meaningful dialogue and learning experiences with their children. The table below is a measure of the counties 0-5 population and how they rank in the five domains measured by the Early Childhood Profile:

Many of the children of our area are being born into a world very much at a disadvantage. These children may be one of the 445 homeless children (K-3) in Boyd, Carter, Elliot and Greenup counties. They may be one of the 636 substantiated cases of child abuse that were documented in the Early Childhood Profiles, this number is up nearly 40 from the 2013 profile data. The stress of everyday life as well as substance abuse, which is a huge issue, often puts these children in harm's way. The Northeast Regional Office of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services-DCBS, reports one of the

highest rates of out-of-home placements (foster care/relative care) in the state, with Ashland, Boyd County being the highest in the region.

However, many protective factors are in place in the region to assist these at-risk families and children in need of additional assistance to equate with peers. More than 300 families were seen by First Steps and HANDS in the four counties (this is the number of families not children so the number of actual children served is likely much higher). We have services available for our 0-5 population and their families through a number of various community agencies, including but not limited to Pathways, Two Hearts Pregnancy Center, Born Learning Academy (FRYSC's, United Way and Toyota), HANDS, and First Steps. Boyd County DBCS offers one of the few START programs in the state. This program is offered to parents of young children who are struggling with addiction and all of the issues that come with it.

Strategic Plan

The Northeastern Alliance CECC's goal is to become the "go-to" for all things early childhood. The Council has noted the various activities from our previous years and that our ability to collaborate with many organizations has been essential for our council's success in our coverage area. The NACECC is composed of various members from the community who represent different backgrounds. The Council continues to evolve and adjust to the needs of the community – something this Council must do to meet the needs of our large rural county area.

Once again, the Boyd County Public School District has agreed to collaborate with us, serving as our fiscal agent. The Boyd County Public School system has

extensive experience in managing funds of various sources, thus their collaboration seemed imperative.

Our Council's desire to achieve a high-quality early childhood climate is deeply rooted in our innovative and collaborative partnerships that promote school readiness for children and families across all learning environments.

In an effort to maximize our usage of funds toward improving early childhood development in the Northeast area, the Council will continue to re-examine its plan of activities on an on-going basis and adjust accordingly – responding to changes within the unique environments of Boyd, Carter, Elliott, and Greenup counties. As always, the NACECC is always looking for additional sources of funding through grants and local organizations in an attempt to sustain our efforts. Active participation by the Council in these efforts will ensure promotion of programs, help early care and education, professionals, families, the business community, and the public at-large gain a greater understanding of early care and education – as well as its impact on child growth and development. Due to the overwhelming success of the Project Manager overseeing the activities of the Council we will again request funding for this position. This request is in large part due to the fact that covering four counties is a delicate endeavor – because the intent of this Council is to allow each county to design and implement desired goals within their community. The project manager will continue to work closely with county event coordinators (local FRYSC staff) to implement and ensure timely data collection and processing.

Therefore, the NACECC has prioritized the following goals and activities.

Goal 1: Engaging Families

- **Kindergarten Transition materials** – Because this Council realizes the importance of a seamless transition into Kindergarten, the NACECC has allocated funds to purchase transition materials to be provided to all FRYSCs in the area to be used in conjunction with their Kindergarten readiness activity. Modeling a very successful Greenup County Program, Ready-Set-Go, for Kindergarten readiness and parenting skills the NACECC will implement an intensive quarterly session program focusing on early childhood domains and their importance in Kindergarten Readiness.
- **Early Learning Information for Parents** – In collaboration with Kings Daughters Medical Center, the area's largest hospital, Parent Guides 0-3 and Parent Guides 3-4 printed by the Governor's Office of Early Childhood will be given to parents as they take their newborns home from the hospital. Parents will also be given information about the NACECC as well as information for programs such as www.zerotothree.org, First Steps and Hands. The information will make parents more aware of the importance of early learning from the beginning of their child's life as well important developmental milestones.
- **Born Learning Academy**- NACECC will support the born learning Academy's that are already in existence in our community by providing information and marketing. Due to the push for born learning Academy expansion with Race to the Top funds and the possible addition of more

programs in our service area we decided as a council not to provide monetary support to these programs this year.

- **Child Abuse Prevention Conference** – The Community Collaboration for Children program, Northeast Region DCBS, Region 7 FRYSC, and a variety of other community partners will once again host the Annual Child Abuse Prevention Conference. This conference is a free two-day event with a national speaker; it offers professional development hours to staff in various child-centric entities, as well as community resources to attendees. Approximately 200 professionals are in attendance and invitations are also given to families of young children.
- **Community Baby Showers** - These events will be held throughout the year in each county. Parents and community members will have the opportunity to attend and receive information about child growth and development. Community agencies will set up booths with a hands-on activity for children and information for attendees. Collaborative agencies for these events include but are not limited to local health departments, HANDS, First Steps, and Commission for Children with Special Health Care Needs.
- **Child Abuse Events** – These events are held throughout the month April in each county. Parents, early care and education professionals, and community members will have the opportunity to attend and receive information about recognizing and reporting child abuse. Community agencies will set up booths with a hands-on activity for children and

information for attendees. Collaboration for this event will include, local DCBS offices, Community Collaboration for Children, Kentucky State Police, FRYSC offices in each county, Hopes Place, Shelter of Hope, and Safe Harbor.

- **Active Parenting Now** – Using Active Parenting curriculum purchased in the last grant cycle, NACECC will continue to offer parenting classes to parents, focusing specifically on the parents of children 0-5 in the 4 county area. This program will teach parents how to develop cooperation, responsibility and self-esteem in their children as well as positive, non-violent discipline techniques.

Goal 2: Supporting High-Quality Learning Environments

- **Early Care and Professional Development** – NACECC will sponsor 4 potential trainers through the credentialing process to address the need for additional high quality trainers in our area. We will host at least 10 training sessions through the fiscal year, including the Early Care and Education Enrichment Extravaganza and the Brigance training. Trainings will be focused on Core Content, Early Learning Standards, STEM, Developmental Domains and Kindergarten Readiness.
- **Brigance Project** – Nearly half of all children in the four county area are not ready to enter Kindergarten. Therefore, the NACECC saw a need for early intervention for children performing below their peers in any of the five domains. In this project, twenty child care centers are participating currently with additional centers added annually. The purpose of this

project is to increase the number of children with disabilities to be identified and begin receiving services prior to entering the public education setting. Staff will continue to be trained on how to implement the Brigance, how to utilize scores to support instruction, and how to modify learning environments for their programs.

Goal 3: Providing Access to Data

- **CECC website** – The NACECC in collaboration with the Lawrence County CECC hosts a website (www.kidsfirstcecc.org), the website was renewed in the last fiscal year for a period of five years. The website will continue to be maintained and updated to provide information to community members regarding the importance of school readiness, CECC activities, and other community events.
- **Community Events (Back-to-School Readifests, First Friday Art Walks, County Festivals, Resource Fairs, and Child Care Center Newsletters)** – NACECC members will set up informational booths at the many community resource fairs and county festivals.

Communication Plan

The Northeastern Alliance Community Early Childhood Council will implement a number of communication strategies to inform the communities we serve about the services available for children ages 0-5 and their guardians. We continue to maintain a website that we will post information on regularly. Members of our council also serve on a number of community committees that will be instrumental in effectively disseminating information about programming, screenings, trainings and school readiness. These

committees include but are not limited to Community Collaboration for Children, CARES, Interagency Councils in each county, Northeast Kentucky Community Action Executive Board, Ashland Community and Technical College, Community Education, and Adult Education programs.

The local newspapers in each county will be contacted for each program sponsored by NACECC in order to solicit an article to bolster attendance and participation. The local television and radio stations will also be invited to attend events for publicity.

Child Care Center newsletters will include information on any activities that are planned. Each child care center will be asked to collect email address for parents and disseminate pertinent information about programming and the GOEC's monthly communication toolkit to the families we serve.

A large number of listservs are already in existence that target early childhood professionals, child care consumers, and community partners with a vested interest in the young children in our four county area. All information, including but not limited to GOEC's monthly communication toolkit, area activities and information regarding websites and electronic newsletters that are relevant to the population we serve, are sent out via these listservs and reach a large number of the population in the communities.

We will continue to utilize community marquees to advertise any events. We also continue to send flyers home to all kindergarten students in the four counties regarding programming that the council will be offering.

Council members will set up booths at various community events including Back-to-School Readifests, First Friday Art Walks, county festivals and resource fairs. The booths will act as a way to reach the community regarding the importance of the first 5 years of a child's life and the skills children need to be "kindergarten ready".

All council members will receive information regarding the webinar series and will be invited to participate. The Chair and/or Project Coordinator will attend at least six of these sessions.
